

Elinor-Early Spring Trip- NormanShippey Memorial Trophy March 19th 2017

After last year's cancelled visit to Elinor because of murky water conditions, today the water was clear and after a mild winter not too cold. Recent reports were promising, but strong winds can often change the response from the fish. And so it proved. The wind blew strongly from the southwest without much respite all day. Temperature hovered about 13 degrees with only short breaks in the cloud.

The day proved challenging for a good turnout of eleven Invicta members, plus a welcome visit from Paul Stevens, there to encourage the troops. We look forward to seeing him back with a rod in his hands in the not too distant future.

Reports that the fish were well spread out meant that anglers started along both north and south shores. The strong cross wind was causing more serious problems to those trying to row their boat back to base. Three of these ended up being hauled up on the downwind bank. It was not clear to us why their crews had decided it was necessary to set the anchors thirty yards inland over the fence. Were they expecting Noah's flood?

Fish proved hard to find along the north bank, but across the other side Chris McLeod, Andy Newman and Alan Briggs found some fish. Andy had a lovely fish near 5 lbs and a few more of these larger fish turned up amongst the healthy fighting stockies. The larger fish seemedless in-

terested in chasing a faster retrieved fly than engulfing a nymph.

Gary How persevered in the windiest corner, determined that this ever reliable fish holding spot would give up its fish eventually. It didn't.

David Moore worked his way round the lake anticlockwise to the western end of this bank and there also found fish. Again lures found little response. Better were buzzers or nymphs cast well out and fished slowly off a floating or nymph tip line. Alan led the field by lunchtime. By this time Chris, having caught a brisk 4 fish had retired hurt with his knee, not yet fully recovered from its abuse in the tropics.

After a companionable lunch in the shelterless car park, we set out again, buoyed by the story that afternoons have proved more productive in recent days. But the fish remained hard to find. What success we had was again more along the southern shore. Steve Harding's practice sessions in his local park bore fruit with an impressive display of casting in such breezy conditions, rewarded by a number of offers and several fish landed. Sue Potts made her way to the Pylon Point at the top of the wind where she hooked a fish and, with no one in range, successfully landed, unhooked and released it. Well done!

Graham Bodsworth finally admitted defeat on the north bank, after insisting he would not move. The relief when he finally broke his blank was audible, and we did hear him planning an early return to the banks of Pitsford.

Only a few fish were added to the totals in the afternoon and Alan remained ahead of David to claim the Memorial Trophy with 11 rainbows.

Happily there were no blanks on this enjoyable, if distinctly difficult day. Let's hope for more temperate conditions for the next outing to Pitsford on 4th April.

Round 1, Pitsford Water, Tuesday 4th April 2017

After a long winter but nothing too severe temperature-wise, Pitsford had begun the season in cracking form. Plenty of fish coming out to bank and boat with North Farm Bay, Stone Barn, The Gorse and the Cliffs all producing good quantities of fish. After 1st April, the Small half restrictions were lifted and Browns were in season, so no excuses as the whole reservoir opened up.

This time last year 29 of us caught 138 fish at a rod average of 4.76. This year there were only 20 anglers but the rod average was 6.25 with 125 being caught in total. But this is only half the

story as these statistics don't count any fish caught after an angler's bag of eight, and many members caught considerably more than 8! The method was buzzers, buzzers, buzzers, with the occasional nymph, on floating lines and midge tips, and fished very slowly.

The weather had turned which seemed to bunch the shoals up so pods were quite tight and sometimes difficult to locate. The bay east of the Gorse fished exceptionally and Stone Barn did well. There were also a few around Duffers, and other odd places, but it was very easy to be just off them, though with 14 limits and no blanks it wasn't too difficult and a great start to the season.

Next outing is to Rutland on 6th May. Let's hope the buzzers are still coming off.
