The **Invicta FFC** Facebook page can be accessed by clicking on the Facebook icon (f) at the bottom right hand side of the footer on every page or the 'Find us on Facebook' symbol on the 'Noticeboard' page.

The page has been set up and is hosted by Andy Newman and gives those joining it the opportunity to read comments left by other members and post messages of their own. So for example if you have visited a fishery recently that impressed you; want to sell that spare reel you never use; need a boat partner next week or know that a particular event is happening or just have some thoughts you wish to air, why not share it with others. The more members that use it, the more useful it becomes.

If you do not already have one, in order to view the Invicta Facebook page you will first need to register with Facebook; this takes only a few seconds. Once you have done this, at the top of your Facebook homepage you will see a box which says 'Search for people, places or things' type Invicta ffc into the box and the Invicta Facebook page will be displayed in the list; select this to go to the page. Once there, you will see a button near the top right of the page that you can select to join the group. Once Andy Newman has accepted your request your name will appear along with other group members and Invicta FFC will appear under Groups on your Facebook homepage. After that, anytime you want to go to the Invicta Facebook page you can either go to your own Facebook page and click the Invicta link under groups, or click the *f* icon at the bottom right of any page on our website.
