A Pleasure Day at Grafham

Friday 11th November looked like being a good day for fishing, so Gary How, Chris McLeod, Alan Briggs, Paul Stevens, David Moore and myself met up at Grafham from late morning onwards for a day's fishing and a bit of socialising.

Alan was the first to arrive and started fishing along the lodge bank and had a couple of fish, while Gary and myself started on G buoy. We found fish quite soon after starting, once the Grafham shuffle drew in the fish. We were both fishing shrimp patterns with a booby on the point. Fish are still very high in the water; I think

that dries would have taken plenty of fish (I had left mine at home). Alan joined us on G buoy and we had some good sport between us, Gary and I still on shrimp patterns, Alan alternating between shrimp patterns and snakes, just goes to show that even the purest can be drawn to the dark side!!!

Chris was the next to join us fishing his each way method, black and green lure on the point with a couple of nymphs on the droppers. Chris found fish in the bay very quickly (only what you would expect from a local expert) Alan went right into the bay and fished a small black and green lure and had a red letter day with his rod constantly bent. Paul joined us followed by David, so we had quite a group fishing with plenty of banter going round.

David caught his dinner so he was happy and Chris joined Alan in the bay, only for Alan to show him how it's done. Gary went over to Coves Point and picked up a couple of fish. Paul and myself fished the right hand side of G buoy, the fishing went a bit guiet for us but the fish that we got were much bigger than the 1½ -21b fish we had during the early part of the afternoon. Alan then joined us on the point (I think he was embarrassed by the poor performance of the local expert fishing next to him!!). We both hooked and lost a good fish each after playing them for quite some time. The fish that I hooked swam at me twice, faster than I could retrieve my line and ran off leaping as it went only to shake the hook on the second run. Shortly after I heard "bugger, bugger, bugger" as Alan lost a good fish as well.

I think we ended up with 40 plus fish between us, so a good day was had by all, the weather was kind to us, although a little on the cold side only to be expected at this time of year. I had a great day and I think I can say the same for the rest of the guys. We must do this more often, I recommend getting together with a few friends on the bank for a day's fishing, the banter, information and camaraderie is second to none.
