River Mel Group

This group has featured in previous Newsletters and in Rob Mongovan's last presentation to the Club. Many restoration projects are relatively short term affairs, in some cases cleaning a village pond in a month or so.

The Mel Group is in its 7th year with no end in sight. Restoration and replanting of the banks is being performed both in Meldreth, where the Group began their work, and Melbourn. Currently approximately two kilometres have been completed on the five kilometre river. This small chalk stream has suffered the ravages of 50 years of neglect and the ill found theories of past water authorities who thought straightening and dredging all water courses was the way forward.

Recent events have seen the delivery of 8 fourteen tonne lorry loads of course gravel and blocks of chalk for use in the culvert under the A10 Melbourn bypass. This necessitated traffic lights on the A10 as the lorries discharged the one tonne bags by crane directly into the river to be set upon by the worker ants frantically raking each bag full away before the next was lowered. This was made possible through a grant from a European Union conservation fund. Another mixed delivery of 4 lorry loads arrived last week through a generous donation from the

Wildlife Trust. In all this will amount to some 130/140 tonnes.

The work is carried out on an average 3 weekly basis throughout the year with occasional mid-week sessions such as the gravel deliveries.
